The presidents of seven Central American and Caribbean nations, along with international leaders in development, business, security and civil society, will come together at the 12th International Anti-Corruption Conference in Guatemala City from 15 to 18 November, 2006, to examine ways to decrease global corruption.

The Conference aims to examine why corruption continues to be widespread, nearly two decades after Transparency International put the subject on the world's agenda. Experts, practitioners, and representatives of the private and public sectors will discuss:

Corruption and poverty, obstacles to social and economic rights, transparent management of natural resources and extractive industries, corruption in the defence sector and embedded networks of corruption, among other topics.

For the first time in its history, the IACC will host a Presidential Panel for Latin America and the Caribbean. Seven presidents from Costa Rica, Dominican Republic, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, Nicaragua and Panama will sign a regional anti-corruption declaration and action plan. Other presidents are also expected to attend the Conference.

Plenary sessions will feature high-level speakers who will assess the current state of corruption and examine possible solutions. They include:
